TIEC Architectural Team Reports on Cairo Visit

TIEC has completed the first phase of a project to establish the design parameters for the master plan of the new Egyptian Technological University in Cairo.

This task is a part of a larger USAID-funded project called Partners for a Competitive Egypt (PfCE).

During the first week of January, 2003, Lewis May and Damian Derby of the Houston office of PageSoutherlandPage, L.L.P. (PSP) visited Cairo, Egypt, where they met with the PfCE staff and visited the offices of the Ministry of Communications & Information Technology (MCIT) to review work in progress and receive a briefing on preliminary programmatic scenarios being developed.

They also toured the proposed campus site and surroundings, as well as several other sites, including existing campuses and facilities.

Following these visits, May and Derby met again with MCIT officials to further develop the space program for the university campus.

The PSP team then reviewed the conceptual campus plans for the new university as developed by MCIT and began to document and photograph the elements of the architectural design criteria to be used for a design competition.

May and Derby submitted a report following their trip, which included Design Competition
